Pastor's Bible Study will restart Wednesday August 6 at 10:00 in the Stockton Building

New Study: Epic of Eden: Deborah – Unlikely Heroes and the Book of Judges

Course Description:

This in-depth Bible study featuring sought-after speaker and teacher Sandra Richter, unpacks why the book of Judges remains critical to our devotional lives today. The Book of Judges narrates one of the most chaotic and morally dark eras of Israel's story. Many speak of it as Israel's "Wild West," where the heroes and the villains stand only inches apart. Into this morally -ambiguous time comes one of the most unlikely leaders of the biblical text—the prophet Deborah. She is a wife and mother in an entirely patriarchal world, yet due to her integrity and courage, she transforms chaos into order and leads Israel in one of the most pivotal victories of the settlement period.

Illustrating the era of the Judges by means of the archaeological record, historical geography, and the hard facts of warfare in the ancient world, this study draws students immediately into the grand tale of Deborah and Barak, Jabin and Sisera, and of course the most unlikely of leaders, Jael. This study compels the modern reader to ask and answer three critical questions:

- What territory can you see from where you're standing that you know belongs to the Kingdom, but is not yet won?
- Is it worth fighting for?
- Are you willing to step out on faith and trust God for the victory?

Book Club News

A novel featuring a wealthy New England black family who had suffered a major trauma was our selection for June. Good Dirt by Charmaine Wilkerson told a interesting story about this modern family while also giving historical background about how the family had its origins in a village in Africa, was brought to America on a slave ship, and made its way to freedom and New England in exciting ways. Wesley Nurse News and Updates- "Life Transitions"

Dear Church Family,

Life never stays the same. There are several stages with unique challenges that make each one memorable. As new parents you add new responsibilities and a baby to your life while trying to establish yourselves as a couple. This new role means sharing your partner with someone else so make sure you talk to each other, have a date night, and share your struggles. Adjustment is easier when you know what challenges exist.

"Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it." – Proverbs 22:6

Sending your first child off to school can be scary for everyone. As a parent, try to put your fears aside and look for the positives: your child is beginning an adventure that will teach him many new things. Before school starts, go to the school and arrange a tour if possible to take the fear out of the new surroundings, remind him/her that others will be nervous about school and there will be many new friends to meet. Talk about the exciting things he/she will be doing during the school day and make it an adventure for both of you. If you have worries about his/her health, be sure to meet with the school.

"The Lord detests double standards; he is not pleased by dishonest scales." - Proverbs 20:23

Gender differences of size, weight, and cellular structure impact the absorption of all types of medications. These issues are initiating new pharmaceutical studies to determine the most effective dosage for the treatment of men and women. Current knowledge shows that menstrual cycles may affect certain antidepressants, liver proteins affect some blood pressure medications, and physical size affects most medication dosages. So the next time you experience a medication adjustment or have your weight recorded at the doctor's office, know it is part of the process to determine the best prescription for you.

"Test me O LORD, and try me, examine my heart and my mind." - Psalm 26:2

Research shows that heart disease impacts men and women differently. Women tend to display heart disease 10 years later than men, but with a more serious outcome. In either sex it is important to know the signs of a heart attack. Men tend to have the classic symptoms of severe chest pain, a squeezing sensation in the chest for 5-10 minutes, profuse sweating, pain radiating to the left arm, and/or a feeling of depression. Women tend to have atypical symptoms of shortness of breath, indigestion, heart palpitations of more than 10 minutes, jaw/shoulder/back pain in excess of 5-10 minutes, nausea, or extreme fatigue. In either case, seek help immediately and call 911. The quicker the response of professional help, the better the outcome.

Culture also impacts the differences between men and women. Biologically, men tend to be risk-takers with speed and dangerous activity, but cultures also foster that behavior. Men are often encouraged to act impulsively or macho while women are taught to be cautious. The Harvard Health Letter states that men with a high sense of masculinity will not seek attention for medical issues or treatment viewed as feminine such as intolerance for pain or eating fruits and vegetables. This research shows that educational material and promotions need to be sensitive not only to culture but also to gender.


